
Fort Carson Environmental Management System

What is an EMS?

An organizational approach to environmental management that is specifically designed to achieve continual environmental improvement.

What Does Our EMS Do?

- Executes the Installation's environmental program to exceed compliance with regulatory requirements.
- Promotes efficiency and reduces costs.

(Part of an activity, product, or service that interacts with the environment.)
