Another point of contrast between Matthew and Luke's presentation is the terminology. In Luke, Jesus contrasts the behavior of his followers with the behavior of "sinners." In Matthew, Jesus contrasts the behavior desired with the behavior of tax collectors and Gentiles. Matthew concludes the teaching about love of enemies with the admonition to be perfect as God is perfect; Luke concludes by emphasizing God's mercy.

In both Gospels, Jesus' words challenge those who would follow him to be more like God. God loves us beyond our expectations, beyond anything we can possibly imagine. In response to God's love, we are to love as God loves, beyond expectations and with a depth beyond imagining.

#### Background on the Gospel Reading

Today we continue to hear Jesus' Sermon on the Plain. Recall that in Luke's Gospel, this teaching is addressed to Jesus' disciples. These words from Jesus' teaching are familiar to us. They constitute the crux and the challenge of what it means to be a disciple: Love your enemies, turn the other cheek, give to those who ask, do unto others, lend without expecting repayment, judge not lest you be judged.

There are several similarities between Luke's and Matthew's report of Jesus' great teaching. Both begin with the Beatitudes. Matthew includes nearly all the content that Luke does; the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew's Gospel is longer than Luke's Sermon on the Plain. There are, however, differences in language and nuance. For example, Matthew presents this portion of the teaching as a contrast between Jesus' teaching and the teachings of the law and the prophets. This is in keeping with Matthew's concern to address his predominantly Jewish audience. It is likely that Luke omits this contrast because it was unnecessary for the Gentile believers for whom Luke is writing.

#### Infant Baptisms (0- 6 years of age) 5 steps:

1. Must contact Fr. Luke (or in his absence, Deacon Rick Bauer) to begin baptism prep process. Must be active duty and registered in the parish at Fort Carson.
2. Must be practicing your faith by regular church attendance (Sundays & Holy Days minimum).
3. Must contact the parish office to register for class.
4. The Pastor will enroll the parents in the required pre-baptismal class that meets at 1900 on the Wednesday before the 4th Saturday of each month with our deacons in the SMC Conference Room unless otherwise noted in the bulletin.
5. Baptisms are celebrated on the 4th Saturday of the month, 1400 hours, at Soldiers' Memorial Chapel.

### Pre-Cana (Marriage Preparation)

Contact one of the active duty priests to assist your preparations. You must begin your pre-marriage preparations, to include pre-marriage counseling (pre-Cana) a **minimum of six months in advance of your wedding.**

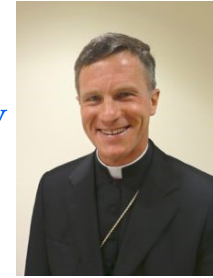

## Archbishop Timothy Broglio to Celebrate Mass of Confirmation: Saturday 1600 hours, SMC



We are delighted to have Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio with us this Saturday, February 23.

He was born in Cleveland Heights, Ohio, he attended parochial schools there and earned a BA in Classics at Boston College, and later an S.T.B. in Theology and a Doctorate in Canon Law from the Pontifical Gregorian University, Rome. Archbishop Broglio was ordained to the priesthood (for the Diocese of Cleveland) on 19 May 1977 in the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception of the North American College, Rome.

From 1977 to 1979 he served as associate pastor, St. Margaret Mary Parish, South Euclid. In February 2001 the Archbishop was named Apostolic Nuncio to the Dominican Republic and Apostolic Delegate to Puerto Rico. The Archbishop was ordained as an Archbishop by His Holiness Pope John Paul II on 19 March 2001. On 19 November 2007 Archbishop Broglio was named the fourth Archbishop of the Military Services, USA, and installed on 25 January 2008, the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul.

A Fourth-Degree Knight of Columbus, he is a Trustee of Catholic Distance University, a member of the Board of Directors of the National Catholic Bioethics Center, and is Chairman of the Communications Committee for the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. Among the Archbishop's many honors include Commander of the National Order of Côte d'Ivoire; Commander of the Order of the Polar Star, Sweden; Knight Commander of the Holy Sepulchre; Honorary Conventual Chaplain of the Order of Malta; Grand Cross of the Order of St. Michael of the Wing; Grand Officer of the Order of Sts. Maurice and Lazarus.

Please greet the Archbishop and welcome him to Fort Carson on this annual visit.
