ACCUPLACER INFORMATION

The ACCUPLACER is a computerized basic skills assessment test designed to provide placement and advising information for students entering college. This test will give you information about your skills in writing, reading, and mathematics, and will tell you at what level you need to begin your college studies. The test is adaptive, which means the ACCUPLACER determines which questions will be given next based upon previous answers. It also means that no two tests taken are precisely the same. You will be told how to get your results after your testing session. Your scores will determine which courses you are eligible to take. The test is composed of three parts:

1. Reading Comprehension: 20 questions related to measuring how well you read
2. Sentence Skills: 20 questions dealing with sentence structure and grammar
3. Mathematics: questions ranging from basic arithmetic to college-level mathematics.

The placement test is very important. We strongly advise that you review math, reading, and writing skills using study materials available in the Army Learning Center (ALC) or use the websites listed on this handout before you take the test.

After completing the test and receiving your scores, you will meet with an education counselor to discuss your results and plan your next steps towards obtaining your college degree.
